The national workshop on “Wild and Pet bird medicine” was selected under the Indo – US Fulbright program. An international expert Dr. Stephen J. Divers, Professor of Zoological Medicine, Department of Small Animal Medicine and Surgery, College of Veterinary Medicine, University of Georgia, USA will conduct the training program. This workshop has been formulated to facilitate zoo veterinarians, faculty from various institutions and private practitioners to understand the basic to advanced concepts in avian medicine. Hence, with this in mind the following objectives have been framed.

- To provide continuing education to improve the clinical knowledge and skills in new and advanced techniques.
- To familiarize the trainees with the available diagnostic, therapeutic options in wild and pet bird medicine.
- To understand and learn about captive management of wild and pet birds.
- To discuss practice management of wild/pet birds and prepare individuals for a career in avian veterinary medicine.
- To teach current surgical and orthopedic procedures in wild and pet birds.
- To handle and treat avian emergencies.

In addition the workshop will be of high standards since the support staff and the institute will provide an excellent ambience. During this workshop the host institution will create a common platform for the trainees to interact, deliberate and discuss common problems, and diseases of the wild and pet birds with the international expert and other qualified staff. This workshop will improve the skills of the trainees in handling and treating wild and pet birds.

Madras Veterinary College is a constituent unit of TAMILNADU VETERINARY ANIMAL SCIENCES UNIVERSITY which was the first Veterinary University of the country. The college has been hailed as one of the best Veterinary Institutes in India and has 30 departments involved in teaching research and extension. The hospital possesses excellent diagnostic and surgical facilities.

- Patient examination, evaluation and triage
- Bandaging and wound management
- Diagnostics (Blood collection and handling, Necropsy procedures, Radiography positioning and interpretation)
- Common orthopedic procedures
- Common treatment protocols and administration of medications
- Fluid and shock therapy
- Anesthesia procedures
- Endoscopy procedures
- Infectious disease diagnosis and management
- Treatment of oiled birds
- Captive management of birds (stress reduction, handling and restraint, nutrition, and caging)
- Philosophy and ethics of wildlife rehabilitation medicine
- Release criteria and procedures
- Field visits

Faculty

This workshop will be conducted by the internationally renowned expert Dr. Stephen J. Divers, Professor of Zoological Medicine, Department of Small Animal Medicine and Surgery, College of Veterinary Medicine, University of Georgia, Athens, USA. A special one day workshop exclusively on “Avian Endoscopy” will also be conducted by him with the help of Karl Storz Company.

Eligibility

Veterinary practitioners, faculties and zoo and wildlife veterinarians. Only 25 participants will be selected.

No TA and DA will be provided. Arrangements for accommodation will be made within the college campus/ hostel on payment basis. Working lunch alone is likely to be provided. Those requiring hotel accommodation will have to intimate well in advance.

Course Fees

The course fee for this program is Rs. 7,500.
